ABOUT THIS COURSE

This course is intended to provide an update on key topics in the management of the critically ill patient as well as to provide hands on training in invasive procedures on live animal models. The first three days is an intensive didactic session where a broad range of topics pertinent to critical care will be discussed. Hands on workshops with Intra-aortic balloon pumps, ultrasonography in the ICU and many other pertinent topics will be offered at no additional charge.

The last day is an all day lab with live animals during which you will practice the invasive procedures necessary for the management of the critically ill. These will include arterial lines, central venous lines, chest tubes, thoracentesis and insertion of a SWAN-GANZ catheter. This is our 4th year of a live animal model for this type of training and the experience is unlike any other.

Completion of the entire 4 days of the course will earn attendees a certificate of completion in invasive procedures from the APACVS that may be provided to your credentialing department of your hospital.

The last day of the course is limited to 60 attendees on a first come basis so get your registration in now!
